

Dear Neighbor(s),

If you are new to the neighborhood, welcome (!), or if you have been here a bit (or even for many years), here is some information to help keep our neighborhood and streets as clean and green as we can.

Trash/Recycling Tips

- If you see some trash in front of your home, please pick it up.
- Do not put recyclables in paper bags since they easily rip open, especially on windy, rainy days. Blue or colored plastic bins are the best.
- Electronics and hazardous waste are not collected curbside, but you can drop these for free at a Sanitation collection site (check the Streets department website below for policy and locations). You can also drop off e-waste (i.e. electronics) for FREE at eForce in Grays Ferry (1229 S. Napa Street, 19146)
- Used mattresses must be wrapped in mattress bags (available at local hardware stores) when
 placed curbside. (Did you know? Philly consistently ranks in the Top 3 cities for bed bugs let's
 keep our sanitation workers safe out there!)
- Pizza boxes with grease on them cannot be recycled, they should be put in with the regular trash. Remember to rinse out your recyclable cans and bottles.
- Plastic bags cannot be recycled with the city. You can recycle plastic bags at various local shops, including South Square Market.
- After most holidays the trash is collected a day later, please refer to the link below for dates (Streets department).
- Ideally, cardboard boxes should be broken down and tied up.
- Help your hardworking sanitation workers by keeping your trash neat and organized.

<u>Trees</u>

- If you'd like a street tree, contact the Pennsylvania Horticultural Society (https://pg-cloud.com/phs/?openform=request-a-tree).
- Your street tree will do best if the tree pit is free of pavers, trash, etc., so that rain water can get to the roots.

Dogs

• Please be mindful of your neighbor's property and do not put "doggie bags" in other people's trash. Your dog's poop belongs in YOUR trash, not your neighbor's.
